Finances: CGEN has a healthy bank balance of about \$13,000, and is managing \$35,000 fundraised for the three Geoscape Ontario projects. The GAC allocation of \$5,000 to CGEN for 2002-2003 is expected shortly.

Careers in Geoscience: The Canadian Geological Foundation has agreed to fund the project (\$2,500). Other fundraising will go ahead once the project details are fleshed out more. Key to that is the template being developed by Jon Dudley; it should be ready shortly and will be circulated to CGEN and other interested parties for comment. John Clague has a co-op student he can assign to researching information. Alan Morgan will see if a University of Waterloo program could take on the website development as a credit project. Mining Association of British Columbia: Maureen Lipkewich has retired; Sheila Stenzel is her replacement. CGEN voted a big thanks to Maureen for her huge contribution to geoscience education and wishes her a happy retirement.

GeoSciEd IV: See top of page and read attached summary report. All CGEN members are asked to help make this a huge success by promoting it locally and attending it. CGEN voted \$1,000 to GeoSciEd in support of advertising in Canadian Geographic.

Geoscape: Geoscape projects are flourishing across the country (website: www.geoscape.nrcan.gc.ca). There may be some interesting cross-distribution possibilities between Lithoprobe and Geoscape (Horst Heise and Bob Turner to discuss). Bob is hoping to set up a Geoscape room at GAC/MAC; check out the program for details. For the future, GSC funding is being sought for Waterscape projects; the next iteration of the Geoscape concept.

EdGeo: See notes above. There were eight EdGEO workshops funded in 2002, with a total of 170 teachers attending. Five are approved for 2003 already, in Calgary and Nunavut. CGEN will provide \$3,000 to EdGEO from the GAC allocation for 2002-2003. The EdGEO committee is embarking upon a fundraiser targeted at "sustaining donors".
